## HOST A GAME DAY

## MAKE A PLAYLIST

Connect over music by creating a shared playlist that everyone can contribute to, and jam out to the result. It's a great way to share your favourite songs, discover new tracks and learn a bit more about your team.

## CHANGE UP THE FORMAT

If your entire team only ever attends routine meetings, experiment with different meeting formats. Create a "virtual breakroom" channel, where you can casually drop in and out throughout the day, or schedule individual or small-group video chats to connect with your coworkers.
