This Saturday, September 30, marks the third year of the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. This day honours the survivors of the residential school system, their families, and their communities. It is an important day for Indigenous peoples and for all Canadians.

Reconciliation is a commitment to ongoing understanding and respect, and this day is an important part of the reconciliation process in Canada. It deepens our awareness of history and encourages understanding and learning for years to come.

In support of our own local Indigenous communities, we have donate \$2,000 to "Operation Street Angel", which is led by the Ktunaxa, and another \$2000 to COINS (Circle of Indigenous Nations Society) and the work they are doing in the West Kootenay Boundary area

What can we do on the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation?

Our goal is to use this time to reflect on and learn about Indigenous peoples and their history. This is a chance for crucial conversations about our country's relationships with Indigenous peoples and an opportunity to listen, learn, and grow together.
